Commission on Population and Development

CPD:

The Commission on Population and Development at the UN plays a critical role in sexual and reproductive health (SRH) by setting policy and monitoring progress toward goals including universal access to SRH services. Member States meet to monitor, review, and assess population trends while also providing appropriate recommendations based on how those trends interact with development issues.

Commission on the Status of Women

CSW:

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is the principal global intergovernmental body exclusively dedicated to the promotion of gender equality.

March 9 – 20, 2026 in New York City

Purpose of the Commission on Status of Women

- Promote gender equality & the empowerment of women & girls.
- Provides a forum for Member States, UN entities, and NGOs to review progress, identify gaps, and negotiate agreed conclusions and resolutions.
- It helps shape global standards, monitor implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (1995), and supports the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

CSW Theme for 2026

- **Priority theme:** Ensuring and strengthening access to justice for all women and girls, including by promoting inclusive and equitable legal systems, eliminating discriminatory laws, and addressing structural barriers.
- **Review theme:** Women's full and effective participation and decision-making in public life, as well as the elimination of violence, for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls.

March 9-20, 2026, United Nations Headquarters, New York.

NGO CSW

- **AND What is NGOCSW???**

- **Organized by and for global civil society**, non-governmental organizations, and feminists to connect them with the official United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UN CSW) process.
- **OVER 750 events**
- NGO CSW Forum: **informs, engages, and inspires grassroots efforts and gender equality advocacy around the world**

While the NGO CSW Forum runs parallel to and complements the UN CSW, it is a separate process with separate organizers.

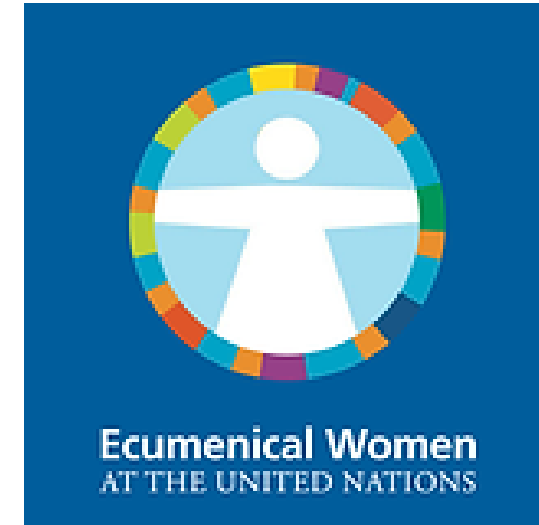

Expected Outcomes and Mechanisms

- Negotiated agreed conclusions by Member States with action-oriented recommendations.
- Adoption of resolutions on specific issues, such as violence against women and poverty eradication.
- Civil Society and UN entities engage through parallel and side events
- Multi-year programme of work (2026–2029) to enhance predictability and preparation time for future CSW sessions.

Civil Society
Participation

- Align strategies and goals with the 2026 priority theme: enabling access to justice for all women and girls.
- Review and adapt policies to ensure they are inclusive, non-discriminatory, and address structural barriers.
- Strengthen women's participation and decision-making in public life and commit to eliminating gender-based violence.
- Monitor CSW70 outcomes, engage with stakeholders, and support implementation at national and regional levels.



Advocacy During CSW

- **Develop recommended language** and issues that should be included in the outcome document based on priorities.
- **Map and analyze Member States** using public statements from government officials to analyze which Member States might be supportive of the issues you are advocating for.
- **Share and meet with receptive Member States** Share recommendations with supportive Member States & set up meetings to advocate for your recommendations.
- **Work with coalitions or other organizations.** Look for collective spaces to support you in carrying out your advocacy objectives.
- **Share on social media** Share your recommendations on social media & with other organizations & networks to garner support.
- **Continue to meet with Member States** Continue to meet throughout the negotiations process.

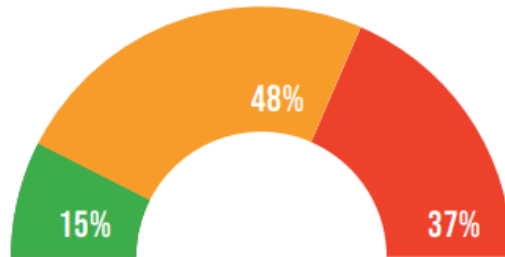
